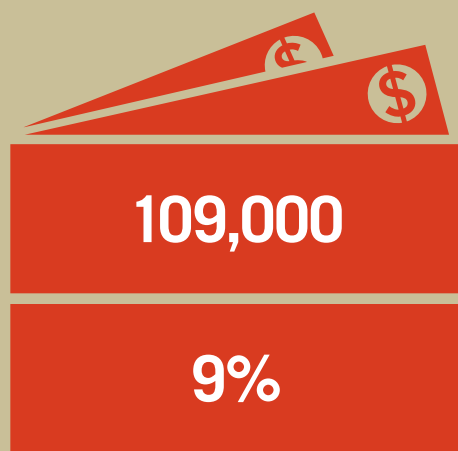


Minnesota

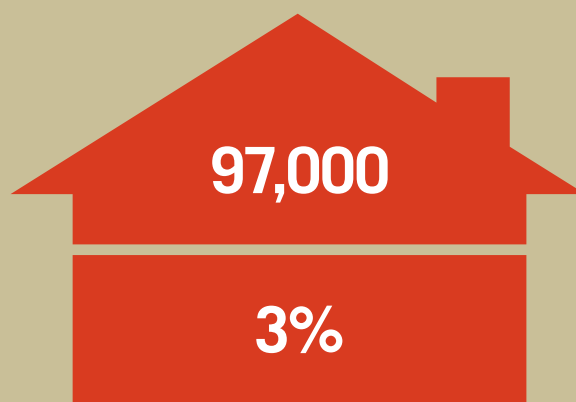
