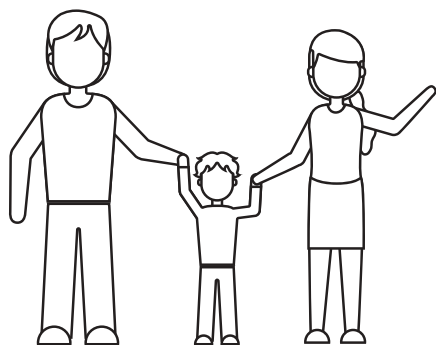




CENSUS 2020: COUNT ALL KIDS

The Census is a questionnaire
used to get a complete
population count of everyone
living in the U.S.

It is critical that we count all
kids in the Minnesota Census so
that children and babies have
the resources they need to be
healthy and on track for a
successful future.

Children under the age of 5 are the
most likely group to be
undercounted.

Children who are missed in the 2020
Census miss an opportunity to be
counted for ten years - most of their
childhood.

The Census helps decide how
much money your community
will get for important resources,
including schools, child care,
summer & after school programs,
and more.

What can you do?

Respond to the census completely and
accurately--it's easy and secure so your
personal data will be protected.

On your form, be sure to include the
information of all people living in the
household on April 1.

Spread the word: Every person filling out the
census form needs to count EVERY CHILD
living at that address, including babies.
